USCF Open	1 team trophy, individual trophies to top 3 players and medals to all

Award Ceremony around 4 pm if not before.

Entry: \$10 per player for advance registration, \$15 on-site registration.

Check-in from 8:00 to 8:30. Round 1 begins close to 9:00. Onsite registration for round 1 ends at 8:15. Pre-registrants arriving after 8:30 and on site registrations arriving after 8:15 can enter the tournament round 2. Please check in as early as possible. For advance registration, register online at www.wisconsinscholasticchess.org before 11:00 pm on Oct 13. Registration fee will be paid at the tournament. Make checks payable to Nicolet Chess Club. **Lunch:** Not available for this tournament

Supervision: At least one designated adult supervisor must be present at all times during the tournament to oversee your school's team, or individual participants who are in K through 8th grade. **Bring:** Pencils, and clocks if you have them.
