Format: Divisions: K – 3, K – 6, and K – 12. Five or 6 rounds and times of G20, G25,.....G30.

Awards: Three individual trophies in each division, five team trophies in divisions K – 3, K – 6. Three team trophies in K – 12. Medals to all.

Entry: \$10 per player for advance registration, (\$15 on site registration) Register online at www.wisconsinscholasticchess.org before midnight of Thursday before the tournament to qualify for advance registration. Check in from **7:45 a.m. to 8:45 a.m.** Round 1 begins at 9:30 a.m. or before. Players not checked in by 8:45 a.m. will begin play in round 2. Please check in as early as possible.

Make checks payable to: Sheboygan Christian School Please pay for registration at the school on the morning of the tournament. (Check or Money Order Only.) Coaches and parents only at registration table, please.

Lunch: Available for purchase on-site.

Supervision: At least one designated adult supervisor must be present at all times during the tournament to oversee your school’s team, or individual participants who are in K through 8th grade.

Bring: Boards and clocks if you have them. Snacks will be available for purchase.
