## 19<sup>th</sup> Annual All Girls Chess Tournament

**Saturday, February 14, 2026**

**Location:** University School of Milwaukee – Middle School Dining Room  
2100 Fairy Chasm Road, River Hills, WI 53217  
*Enter parking lot via driveway furthest west. Use Door 17 west of school building.*

**Format:** Three Divisions:\* K5u500, K8u900, and Open. Five round Swiss style, Game 30.

*\* WSCF reserves the right to change division parameters to balance division size and to create fair competition. \**

Check-in from 8:00 to 8:45 a.m. *Please check-in as early as possible.* Round 1 begins at or around 9:15-9:30 a.m. Onsite registration for Round 1 ends at 8:30 a.m. Pre-registrants arriving after 8:45 a.m. and onsite registrants arriving after 8:30 a.m. can enter the tournament in Round 2.

**Entry Fee:** \$40 per player for advance registration, \$50 on-site registration.

**Awards:** Two team trophies and seven individual trophies per division. Medals to all competitors.  
*Awards start around 4:00 p.m. or earlier. A team needs at least three players to win a trophy.*

**Concessions:** Breakfast, snacks, and lunch available for purchase. Bring cash!

**Supervision:** At least one designated adult supervisor is always required to chaperone Chess Teams and individual competitors in kindergarten through 8th grade.
