## Morse Chess Club Tournament

Saturday, January 10, 2026

**Location:** Morse Gifted and Talented Middle School – 1<sup>st</sup> Floor/Westside; Skittles in Library.  
6700 N. 80<sup>th</sup> Street, Milwaukee, WI 53223

**Format:** Four Divisions: K5u500, K8u750, K8u900, and Open. Five round Swiss style, Game 30.

**Awards:** Three team trophies per division, five individual trophies per division, and medals to all.

*Awards at approximately 4:00 p.m. or earlier. Note that a team needs at least three players to win a trophy, and WSCF reserves the right to change division parameters and names to balance division size and to create fair competition.*

Check-in from 8:00 to 8:45 a.m. Round 1 begins between 9:15 to 9:30 a.m. Onsite registration for Round 1 ends at 8:30 a.m. Pre-registrants arriving after 8:45 a.m. and onsite registrants arriving after 8:30 a.m. can enter the tournament in Round 2. *Please check-in as early as possible.*

**Entry Fee:** \$20 per player for advance registration, \$25 on-site registration.

**Supervision:** At least one designated adult supervisor is always required to chaperone Chess Teams and individual competitors in kindergarten through 8th grade.
