## Thomas Jefferson Middle School Chess Tournament

**Saturday, January 24, 2026**

- Location:** Thomas Jefferson Middle School – Library and Cafeteria  
1403 N. Holden Street, Port Washington, WI 53074
- Format:** Three Divisions: K5u500, K8u900, and Open. Five round Swiss style, Game 30.
- Awards:** Three team trophies and three individual trophies per division. Medals to all competitors.

*Awards at approximately 4:00 p.m. or earlier. Note that a team needs at least three players to win a trophy, and WSCF reserves the right to change division parameters and names to balance division size and to create fair competition.*

Check-in from 8:00 to 8:45 a.m. Round 1 begins between 9:15 to 9:30 a.m. Onsite registration for Round 1 ends at 8:30 a.m. Pre-registrants arriving after 8:45 a.m. and onsite registrants arriving after 8:30 a.m. can enter the tournament in Round 2. *Please check-in as early as possible.*
